

Lemon-Flavored Salt Water Is Fined

Research Reveals Aid Against Heat Strokes

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — Two Ohio State University researchers believe football players would have added protection from heat stroke if they had all the lemon-flavored salt water to drink they wanted.

Although only about 13 deaths in a year in football are attributed to heat stroke, that is still a pretty high price to pay for something that is preventable.

Dr. Donald K. Matthews and Edward L. Fox of the physical education department have been conducting tests on heat stroke, because, Fox said, it causes 18 per cent of all football deaths.

Matthews and Fox found that full uniforms caused a dramatic temperature increase. They said coaches and players would be far better off if they started practicing in shorts and T-shirt and gradually added the uniform.

A little lemon or lime flavoring would make it more palatable, Fox said. The researchers are interested in testing out their theory by having a football team lock under a shower in full uniform before going out to a two-hour practice on hot, muggy days.
